REPORT OF THE FIRST VIEWING IN ERMELO — JANUARY 4, 2025:

The first viewings of the stallion selections in the Netherlands took place the 4th of January in Ermelo. Nice to mention that there was more audience than at any of the other first round selection days in the other breeding directions this season!

A total of 11 stallions received an invitation for the second round viewing at the KWPN Stallion Show in Den Bosch. The US owned and based stallion Macho has most sons selected: four of them! Two Magnifiek sons were selected, and Icellie, Neon GSM, Cizandro, Roy M and Sallandt's Long Train Running each have one son invited to the second viewing. Five of the selected stallions had the preferent stallion Cizandro as damsire.

REPORT OF THE SECOND VIEWING AT THE STALLION SHOW IN DEN BOSCH – FEBRUARY 1, 2025:

Saturday the 1st of February, it was time for the 2nd round of the KWPN Harness stallion selection. This selection round traditionally takes place at the KWPN Stallion show in Den Bosch. There were 12 stallions presented, and six of them were selected for the performance test. On the 20th of February, the after-keuring took place, an extra inspection moment organized for stallions that could for some reason not come to the first- or second viewing. Two stallions were selected for the performance test there, Surprise T and Santos.

Samba, an impressive chestnut with a lot of white by Macho out of a dam by the preferent Cizandro, won the Champion's title in Den Bosch. He was definitely a crowd favorite throughout the entire selection.

The Chair of the Stallion Committee, Wim Versteeg, commented that he was the most complete stallion with the best suppleness. The title of Reserve Champion went to Sam, a son of the preferent Cizandro out of a Larix dam. Sam also is a chestnut with a lot of white, that showed a very complete performance.

PERFORMANCE TEST:

The KWPN has put a new procedure in effect for the performance tests of the young stallions- they cannot participate in the spring performance test anymore in the year they turn 3. They can only participate in the fall performance test of that year, or they can wait a little longer and come to the spring performance test in the year they turn 4.

Before the stallions can actually start their test, they need to be presented in harness for the jury three times. On the attached sheets you can find the other requirements the stallions need to fulfill before starting the performance test.

During the performance test, which will take 28 days, the stallion committee will assess the following points as mentioned in the sheet below. The stallions are judged on these points multiple times during the test and can be asked to leave the test if they don't show sufficient development and improvement.

The owners can decide to keep the stallions in the test at their own expense (extra costs per day), regardless of the judges' assessment during the test. If the stallion then shows enough improvement, he can still get approved at the end of the test (this actually happened with two stallions during the 2024 test).

Before the performance test starts:

- The selected stallions must have met the requirements for PROK, roaring and semen
- The selected stallions have to be presented in harness three times before the performance test starts in autumn 2025
- At the first time also Ster and 2nd round stallions can be presented in harness regarding a second chance to get an invitation for the performance test. If they get selected they will join the already selected stallions.
- The third time, on the day the performance test starts, the stallion committee will make a final decision if the stallion will be allowed to join the performance test
- Before entering a stable in Ermelo a vet-check is also required
- The performance test in autumn 2025 will take about 28 days

Magnifiek Writes Oregon Trophy Trilogy

The Oregon Trophy has been held at the KWPN Stallion Show in 's-Hertogenbosch since 1998. Three KWPN top stallions entered a titanic battle, including two newcomers. Magnifiek took the lead and won the Oregon Trophy for the third time.

The jury included Joop van Wessel as chairman, Demi van Nispen and Johan Holties. The riders already have the necessary experience, but participating in the Oregon Trophy remains a unique affair. Defending champion Latino (v.Dylano) and his rider Mark de Groot missed this edition.

Magnifiek with rider Lambertus Huckriede from Enschede participated. There is actually no prize he has not yet won, he has won the Oregon Trophy twice before and can now record a third time.

Oberon and Olympus HS

Two six-year-olds presented themselves at this harness horse party. First of all, that is Olympus HS (v.Icellie, f. Henk Minkema from De Wilgen), ger. Handelshuis Schuttert from Ommen in the hands of Harry van Middelaar, also Oregon Trophy winner and participant last year. Olympus HS has also performed very well and very successfully for several years and this combination also pulled out all the stops.

What a nice horse, that promises something for the future. The stallion Oberon (v.Icellie, f. Harrie Tonnaer from Ysselsteyn), ger. Gebr. van Manen from Ede is also six years old and the same can be said of this stallion in terms of performance. He also has a beautiful, successful career to his name. Oberon participated with rider Robbie van Dijk and felt like a fish in the water among all the harness fans on this harness horse evening. Oberon ran like a clock; constant and powerful.

Oberon Delivered the Most Harness Horse Foals in 2024

In mid February, the dressage and jumping stallions with the most foals of 2024 were highlighted. Looking back on last year, it appears that almost 10,500 foals are registered with the KWPN. Breeders can also register their foals again in 2025. But which harness horse stallions have the most foals to their name in 2024?

Of the foals registered in 2024, approximately half come from the dressage direction and the other half from the jumping direction. In addition, 197 Gelderland and 503 harness horse foals were added.

Icellie blood dominates

Icellie blood dominates in foals born in 2024. Competition winner Oberon brought the most foals, after which we see his father Icellie in second place. Then we see show-stopper Macho, and then another Icellie descendant follows in Olympus HS. Three-time Oregon Trophy winner Magnifiek closes top 5.

Olympus PSH Convincing Winner in The Tribute Cup

A very special field of participants, as we can call the new section, The Tribute Cup, in which five competition horses participated. But the jury was also special: four-in-hand drivers Boyd Exell and Dries Degrieck. This section was also a fascinating part of the harness horse evening. Convincing winner in the battle was Olympus PSH.

A particularly diverse group in terms of age, the five participating horses, which undoubtedly enter into a fascinating battle in the arena. The two international top drivers Boyd Exell and Dries Degrieck will place these five horses with Johan Holties. How did the two drivers view these competition horses? What did they find important?

Compassionate audience

After the first round, all horses went around again in a stand show. Ultimately, three were allowed to drive over again. Of these, the fantastically marching Olympus PSH came first for a well-meaning audience. Boyd Exell called him a very modern and good horse. Six-year-old Olympus PSH (Kordaat x Hikaru-star of Manno, f. G. Lokhorst from Ermelo, ger. Stal Pos from Ankeveen) is presented by Marcel Ritsma, who has not had the chestnut in his stable for very long. In 2022 he was offered by H. Bos at the stallion keuring. He made it to the second viewing and went to Leo Wijkmans. In the hands of Henk Hammers,

he made his competition debut at Indoor Exloo 2023 and won the newcomer class there. He now has 55 winning points, with spectacular matches. So now we see it in the hands of Marcel Ritsma.

Parla Pardoux

Parla Pardoux (Dylano from Isandra star of Colonist, f. JJ and MCR de Boer from Mantinge), ger. and rider Aris van Manen opened the competition. He started his career last year as the best newcomer and won at Indoor Ambt Delden and Indoor Exloo. The promising dark bay has not been shown very much, it has six winning points, but in Den Bosch he will again show what he can do.

Experienced competition horse

We also saw the experienced competition horse Action Quality Pavarotti (Bocellie from Emely W star by Manno, f. AG van Ooyen from Koekange), from and with Leendert Veerman. This black stallion has managed to realize a great competition career in the hands of Niek Altling. He won the newcomer class at Indoor Houten en Roden last year and was the North winner's competition. The stallion also took part in the stallion approval last year. He has 18 winning points.

Neon GSM

Also a stallion that can always be counted as a participant is the seven-year-old stallion Neon GSM (Bocellies Matteo from Daymonde keur from A New Day GSM, f/g Jan Thijs Seinen from Punthorst, co-/ger. Albert Lueks from Diever) who will now also be the driver. The stallion achieved particularly great success with Lieke Lueks and always manages to present himself in his entirety with a lot of style and in a showy manner. The bay stallion has 146 winning points.

Heliotroop

To conclude was the thirteen-year-old stallion Heliotroop (Colonist from Wunita star pref prest PROK from Reflex M, f. Joop van Wessel from Zwarteboek, g. Mts. Naber from Nieuw-Weerdinge) in the arena. Henk Hammers is his driver, but he also did very well last year in the hands of his owner Grietje Naber. Not only in the women's section, Grietje also managed to drive him to the top position in the premier class. Heliotroop has 400 winning points.

The Mare Makes the Difference: Silvalina

Silvalina (Manno x Renovo)

Silvalina comes from a breeding family that has become a household name. This Manno daughter is a descendant of the Kondalina line of Sijmen and Greet Korevaar. These very first Breeders of the Year bought the mare Gonda, bred to Gloriant, from Henk van Middelaar in 1968. The Korevaars name her first foal Kondalina and all fillies born in their stable are then given the suffix 'alina'. This also applies to Silvalina, whose breeding performed very exceptionally on the most recent National Harness Day.

Ster-preferent-prestatie mare Silvalina, who died in 2017, once again put the breeding power of the Kondalina line into practice on National Harness Horse Day in Lunteren. Her great-showing and flaunting seven-year-old elite daughter Mylady-Silvalina (v.Cizandro), by and with Cees Brouwer, then becomes a top sports mare and wins the Greet Bergstra Bokaal.

In that Final of the National, Silvalina's granddaughter Hannalina (keur sport-tuig of Crescendo HBC from Briannalina keur pref of Larix), from and with Ad Bakx, belongs to the top 5 with a very good performance. Her half-sister Johannalina (v.Cizandro), by and with Dicky Veerman, then finished sixth in the category for nine years and older broodmares. Top sports mare Mylady-Silvalina also produces two-year-old Symylady, this Macho daughter of William and Erin Duffy became champion



among the two-year-old mares. In total, the audience in Lunteren saw seven breeding products from the Kondalina tribe, of which Silvalina's descendants are key players.

Never Trained to Drive

Sijmen Korevaar died in 2022 and his wife Greet in 2024. Their two daughters Els and Marja did not continue breeding and the question was who can tell us a thing or two about Silvalina.

A call to daughter Els Korevaar (59), who lives opposite the parental farm, brought a lot of information. Els begins by apologizing that she will not be able to give that flowery information as her mother could have. Nevertheless, Els has a lot of information to share about her family breeding program. She was always there and still keeps up with the ins and outs of the horses from their line. Silvalina, born in 1999, is a daughter of Manno from the preferred Renovo daughter Gradalina, who had five foals. As a three-year-old, Silvalina became a star at the CK Heerjansdam with the scores 77-74-75. Silvalina was never driven.

Els: "My father and mother usually trained the horses to drive themselves at that time, but I just don't think it happened.

Silvalina was a very luxurious, beautiful mare with a beautiful neck and a very beautiful head. She was a beautiful and willing horse but one that had to be presented in a particular way. You had to know how to present her. You had to release her in her head position. She wanted space, not tight on the rope, otherwise she would put her nose away. You had to know her and then she was very affectionate. I remember well seeing her trotting here in the meadow and watching how good that was."

Silvalina's full brother Thorwald was shown, this competition gelding achieved no fewer than 195 winning points at Stal Jaap van Tunen from Heemskerk.

Silvalina Breeding

Together with Els, we put Silvalina's most important breeding products in a row. She has brought ten foals, a not so large number for a Korevaar mare. Nevertheless, Silvalina managed to posthumously obtain the performance award due to her striking breeding last year.

Silvalina's first foal, Reflex M son Whiskey HBC, born in 2003, is purchased by Jan Schep and immediately becomes an approved stallion. He achieved 22 winning points in the hands of Harry van Middelaar and the chic and elegant stallion started his competition career in 2006 with a victory in the newcomer class during the UPD. Whiskey HBC only serves breeding for two years then Schep sold him. About twenty descendants of Whiskey HBC are registered, including a designated stallion, but also a very striking competition horse, namely Cognac H (from Wonderroos ster van Opgenoort, breeder H. Hammers from Warnsveld). In the hands of his boss

Nico Calis, Cognac H achieved 268 winning points.

Briannalina

Torino's daughter, born in 2005, is involved in dressage, followed by the preferred Larix daughter Briannalina in 2006. This NMK mare brings twelve offspring and is thus responsible for Silvalina's striking grandchildren.

Her first foal is the aforementioned NMK

mare Hannalina. Hannalina becomes keur with an IBOP of 78.5 points and now she is also a sportsmare with 192 winning points with Ad Bakx from Liempe.

Crescendo HBC's daughter won many first prizes, won the broodmare championship twice in South and was second under saddle in Hoogland with Ad's daughter Margot. Hannalina has a five-year-old daughter by Cizandro. Briannalina is also home to the elite mare Johannalina, born in 2014. This NMK mare is making waves as a sports horse at Stal Henk Minkema in the Wilgen and achieves 68 winning points.

The Cizandro daughter scored an IBOP of 80.5 points. She also brings two foals to Stal Minkema and Johannalina

is now a competition mare with Dicky Veerman from Goudswaard. In 2018, Johannalina brought the filly Nadialina from Eebert to A. den Boer from Molenaarsgraaf and there this granddaughter of Silvalina also became an NMK mare.

Keeping Filly, Selling Older Mare

After Briannalina, a number of foals from Silvalina follow and are sold. Els: "Stallion foals were always sold. My father had the rule that an older mare had to go if we had a filly. No stables were added. This sometimes led to discussions." One of those colts, Igor, born in 2013, does contribute to Silvalina's performance predicate acquired last year.

The son of Bakschord HBC is classified at Z2 level in dressage and runs in driving at Z level. Then we go to Silvalina's last foal, the June 2017 born filly Mylady-Silvalina (by Cizandro). Her life looked equally worrying as a foal, says Els: "Silvalina was hit by a small aneurism in August 2017 and had a hard time walking.

She also stepped on a Mylady-Silvalina foreleg. That didn't look very nice, but it turned out completely fine. Silvalina passed away a few weeks later."

The less than three-month-old Mylady-Silvalina therefore had to become independent at an early age. However, Mylady-Silvalina had already been purchased as a foal by Jan van Manen, who then sold her to the Den Otter brothers.

"We went to Korevaar when Mylady-Silvalina was about a week old. Mother Silvalina was a very large, beautiful and luxurious mare who could move well. She had a very well developed withers/shoulders and she was noticeably built uphill. What is there to say about a week-old foal? She spoke to us all around and we bought her.

She then had that accident, but when Jan van Manen delivered her to us, she was four months old and nothing could be seen anymore, says Piet den Otter.

Studbook and IBOP

As a three-year-old, Mylady-Silvalina, presented by Robbie van Dijk, scores 85 points in the IBOP. She will then be included in the studbook with points 74-78-76. "It was in corona time", Den Otter explains. "We wanted to have her shown that year, but the question was whether there would be enough competitions. We then had her covered by Macho and in 2022 Symylady was born. Chantal van Dijk bought the foal at the Macho descendant inspection and last year she became general champion in the South and national champion among the two-year-olds at their stable.

Mylady then brought two more foals from Macho and with that third foal at her foot she went to Cees Brouwer. We sold the second filly to Martin Vos from Wijk and Aalburg. We no longer have anything from the Korevaar tribe. You

can also get too many horses if you never want to sell anything", the breeder decides, laughing.

Foal of Oberon

Mylady-Silvalina now suckles a foal from Oberon and has now been mated again by Ricardo. The mare will also be shown by Robbie this year. The colt Uzandro, a son of Macho from last

year, still has Cees. "I'm very careful with that. I think it's a very special", he says. He plans to also let Mylady-Silvalina become a preferent and achievement, as does her mother Silvalina.

"I am obliged to continue the tradition of this breeding family", says Cees who certainly sees potential.

As for Symylady, Robbie and Chantal sold her to the Duffy family in America just before the NTD last year, but she's still here. The plan is to offer her at the IBOP and for studbook recording on April 18. She has now been PROK approved. Symylady will also be brought into the stallion this year, the question remains which one.

In the fall, Symylady goes to the Duffy family where she becomes her father Macho's stablemate. Hopefully she can continue the power of this valuable breeding stock in the United States.

KWPN-NA Harness Horse Highlight

Kiralonda



In Decemer, KWPN-NA featured the very lovely Keur Sport Harness mare Kiralonda (Globetrotter x Talos). Kiralonda is bred and owned by KWPN-NA breeder Raymond Stoltzfus of Treasure Hill Stables in Pennsylvania.

"I am a farrier," Raymond says. "I started my own business in 2000 after 2 years of working as an apprentice. That is where I became familiar with Dutch Warmbloods and soon after I met the Dutch Harness horse too. I really admired them but I didn't buy my first Dutch Harness horse until 2012, when I got Fieke. She was then a 2-year-old."

"In 2013, I bought Alonda," Raymond continues. "She was in foal to Baanbreker for the next year. I bred her to the then newly approved Stallion Globetrotter of Aaron Fisher. This was his first breeding season in the USA but he looked great and seemed to fit Alonda well. Kiralonda was born in June and she didn't disappoint! She didn't go to the keuring as a foal though, because that was in Ohio that year, too far for us. As a 3-year-old she did go, to the Rocky Ridge keuring in Pennsylvania. She got Ster and she was the Keuring Champion!"

"When Kiralonda became Ster, her mother received her Preferent, which was very nice of course. As a 4-year-old, Kiralonda went to the Keuring again and became Keur passing the IBOP. She was then bred to Jaleet. Prince Charming was born from that cross and is still in my barn. The next year she had Romeo by Delviro. Plans are to take Romeo to the Keuring for licensing coming year as he is now PROK. In 2023, Kiralonda had a filly by Atleet. And she earned her sport predicate that same year!"



“Probably the biggest highlight of Kiralonda’s career so far was in 2024 when she was invited to the 1st ever Fine Harness Horse Trophy at Live Oak International in Ocala Florida. She was named the winner on the first day with me and then the next day, Celebrity guest driver Chester Weber drove her and she won again!”

What is Kiralonda’s character like? We asked Raymond. “Kiralonda is very friendly in the barn and loves attention,” he says. “But when she is hitched she is all business and always willing to work. When she goes into an arena she always gives 100% and never stops going. She is so powerful, always happy to give her all and she loves the show! Kiralonda is in foal to Vaandrager for 2025. Hopefully I can get some more foals from her!”

Thank you Raymond, we can’t wait to see her shine in the show ring and at the Keurings again next year!
